RECITATION OF BRIEF HISTORY HISTORY

In 1971, Caves Beach Uniting Church did not yet exist. The congregation met at Swansea Methodist Church, then located where the Swansea Nova Care Hall stands today. Seeing future growth, Rev. Bruce Walker helped secure land at Caves Beach for a new church and preschool.

Initially, worship was held in the preschool building until the current church and community centre were completed in 1976-77. In 1977, with church union, it became the Caves Beach Uniting Church. In 1998 nearby

churches at places like Catherine Hill Bay and Nords Wharf were merged into Caves Beach Uniting and the funds raised from the sales designated for future needs.

Over time the church was a hub of activity for the community with many and varying activities. The local youth were provided with classes for the unemployed. Members of the Church accompanied young people to job interviews and often attended court with young people.

There was a tradition of providing Sunday night dinners which provided fellowship for people having a difficult time and those who were lonely. The active Ladies' Fellowship had monthly meetings. They also had cake stalls and contributed to fetes. They were active in regional fellowship gatherings. Fashion parades were held as well as stalls selling pre-loved goods. On one occasion they even had a Scarecrow Competition.

Another popular activity was Meet and Learn. There was painting and a craft group. The artistic endeavours led to occasional painting exhibitions. Sessions on creative writing were mixed with drama and French lessons. Many members remember the line-dancing and exercise classes, a walking group, carpet bowls and card games.

There was also a Friendship Club in the congregation.

Music was also an important part of the church activities. The church choir was popular along with musical evenings. Regular Carols by Candlelight are fondly remembered along with talent quests including entrants from local high schools. There was also a monthly sing-along at which residents from local aged care facilities participated and children from the preschool would sometimes come and sing.

In 1994 a play group was started led by Jean Gersbach who was ably assisted by other members like Dot Craig, Margaret Best, Pat Dadge and Carol Hayes. This activity continued until 2000. Later there was a Kids' Club started by Sue Angel and Elaine Roberts assisted by Dorothy Craig and Ray Englert. When this tapered off the Club was revived later by June Hook and Elaine Roberts.

At one stage there was even a Pets' Service. People brought their pets to church. The local Vet, Phil Wilson, commented: "I never thought that I'd sit next to a chook in church."

From its inception the preschool was a community activity overseen by the church. The mounting governance and legal requirements and dwindling community numbers made it difficult for the voluntary Management Committee to function effectively and led to the decision that the preschool should be transferred to Uniting Early Learning. This transition was taking place as COVID swept across the world. This disruption meant that the full transition was not completed until early this year.

By the start of COVID it was recognised that there were some serious structural issues with the church foundations. Large cracks were appearing in the brickwork. Under the guidance of the late Rev Bob Willoughby and his capable wife, Val, engineers and builders were given the task of correcting these issues.

These works were largely done early in COVID times utilising funds from the earlier sale of the smaller churches.

With the disruption most activities were cancelled. Things like the monthly sing-along were cancelled. Unfortunately, in a changed world this activity has not been able to resume.

Recognising the changing world in which we live the congregation embarked on a deliberate program to explore where our new mission directions were leading. This was undertaken with input from both Synod and Presbytery. Small groups of the congregation met a number of times to acknowledge our history and explore where we should focus our future directions.

With the ending of the COVID disruptions there was also the recognition that the car park needed radical upgrading. This was explored with Uniting and engineers were engaged. The capital cost of this work was well beyond the capacity of this small and older congregation. Discussion also recognised that the principal stewardship of the various activities on the site here at 52 Park Ave needed to be rationalised and a cooperative framework developed into the future. As part of this exercise the physical assets of the Preschool devolved to Uniting Early Learning.

There is now a Memorandum of Understanding covering the Independent Living, Early Learning and the congregation. All signatories are part of the Uniting Church. In this process there were some funds dispersed which has allowed the congregation to contribute to the significant capital works program. As the program wound up a significant effort was made to refresh the church building and its facilities. New paint, upgraded lighting, the installation of air conditioning and a new sound system have enhanced the congregation's experience along with new furniture in the church.

As a congregation we can now look forward to growing our community. We continue to have an active association with our community through things like the Craft and Chat group which meets on Wednesday mornings.

This transfer of assets has allowed the congregation to develop a position of a Community Engagement Coordinator. Funding is now available to ensure that this project can continue for a number of years.

The congregation has appointed Rebecca Arthur as our Community Engagement Coordinator to foster deeper community connections. Already Rebecca has connected with local groups, council contacts and the broader Church including Presbytery and Synod contacts. Recently the Crop Swap held each month during growing season attracted a lot of interest and visitors to our church. Future plans include playgroups in local parks where there are no community facilities for young families and a social group for board and card games. Both of these are planned to commence next year.

Guided by our motto of 'Faith, Community, Connection' we look forward to growing together in meaningful ways, building an inclusive and vibrant congregation.
